

SMCS Risk's Dogging Accreditation Course (DAC) gives Doggers the necessary skills and knowledge to safely and efficiently undertake Dogging work in a range of working environments.

Our fully accredited and qualified Instructors conduct the Australian Standard course in Khmer or English and provides participants an intensive 5 days of training.

The DAC gives Doggers the skill and knowledge to safely conduct a broad range of lifts as well as total comprehension regarding lift capacities, equipment maintenance, risk assessments, situational awareness and all other aspects related to Dogging.

Each course can be conducted at the participants' workplace to give the student real world operational experience, and consists of theoretical, practical, and assessment modules. Where a theory classroom is unavailable, classes are conducted in SMCS Risk's training facility.

All participants who successfully complete the Dogging Accreditation Course will receive a certificate, as well as an official Accreditation Card.
